Current State

- WVH and work-related mental harm reduction continue to be a priority focus area for the MLITSD
- OSHCO tools were launched in May 2010
 - Work has changed a lot in the last 14 years
- Incidents of workplace violence, harassment and uncivil behaviours continues to increase



State of Workplace Violence and Harassment in Canada

2022 Survey by Western University, University of Toronto and Canadian Labour Congress:

- Over 70% of nearly 5000 respondents have experienced at least one incident of WVH in the past 2 years
 - Across sectors
 - Third-party and co-workers are most common perpetrators
- Other studies indicated "across the board":
 - Increase in severity, frequency
 - Increased fear to report and retaliation
 - New harasser tactics
