# **Ergonomists**

Ergonomics is the field of study that focuses on how humans interact with their surroundings, objects, and other people. Ergonomists aim to optimize well-being and overall performance by creating tasks designed to work smoothly with the human body. They match the job to the worker, thereby reducing and preventing injury while increasing productivity. The Occupational Health Clinic for Ontario Workers (OHCOW) has a team of six certified Ergonomists that includes registered kinesiologists, all with extensive experience ranging from 5-30+ years.

#### **1** Clinical Services

Clinical Services are the main activity at OHCOW. Ergonomists use their expertise to identify what can caused a worker to develop a musculoskeletal disorder (MSD), also known as an injury to the skeleton, skeletal muscles, ligaments, tendons, joints, cartilage, and other connective tissue. They investigate the patient's work history, job duties, medical history, and other relevant research. In addition, they investigate work hazards such as force, repetition, and awkward posture. The Ergonomics Report that is created can support a compensation claim or appeal. Knowledge gained from this process can be applied for educational purposes in other workplaces.

#### Workplace Services

Employers, workers, Joint Health and Safety Committees (JHSC), and unions can contact OHCOW Ergonomists for workplace assessments, large or small. An OHCOW Ergonomist will discuss the request with the representative(s) and determine if a worksite assessment is needed and should be performed. Individual office assessments cannot be done repeatedly for sustainability reasons. However, a few examples can be provided along with accompanying education to empower the parties to apply the concepts throughout the workplace.

OHCOW Ergonomists provide education sessions for workplaces, employers, workers, Joint Health and Safety Committees (JHSC), Unions or professionals on assorted topics, including tailoring the session to a task, operation, or workplace. These sessions can be held virtually, in person, or as part of a prepared e-course.

OHCOW also hosts the highly popular and long-standing Repetitive Strain Injury (RSI+) Day every February. The event is now a weekly webinar series covering general and specific topics featuring research and insights from our staff and guest speakers. Recordings are part of our Youtube archive of valuable on-demand educational resources.
